Sutter Club Display's 150th Anniversary Memorabilia

Facility Remodel

As part of the construction/modernization bond measures passed by voters several years, Sac High is currently undergoing major renovations to the East Wing of campus. More than half of the facility is being re-constructed to allow for additional classroom space. The construction that

began during the summer of 2006 is not expected to be completed until 2008. The Sac City Unified School District has provided Sac High with portables to better accommodate the students who have been displaced due to the East Wing's closure.
