Sac High Uniform Dress Code 2009-2010

Overview

A student's dress and general appearance should not draw undesirable attention to the student, nor should dress and appearance detract or interfere with teaching and the learning environment. It is expected that all students shall maintain their appearance and clothing in a modest, clean and age-appropriate fashion consistent with our dress code and compatible with the instructional program.

It is expected that students be in FULL COMPLIANCE with the Sac High dress code. Students not in compliance will be subject to disciplinary consequences.

Benefits of School Uniforms

Establishes a friendly and professional atmosphere that promotes pride, respect and safety

Instills a sense of community to which students belong

WHAT YOU CAN WEAR

Shirts & Jackets

- Sac High polo shirt (black, white or purple with small school designation)

- Sac High sweatshirts

- All students will be required to wear school-issued attire from the waist up.

- Shirts worn under a Sac High polo must be black, white or purple

Note: Shirts must be tucked in and buttoned.

Pants & Skirts

- Black, tan, gray or white pants (Dockers style)

- Black, tan, gray or white shorts (Dockers style)

- Black, tan, gray or white skirts (no higher than 3" above the knee)

Note: Pants, shorts and skirts must fit appropriately and be worn at the natural waist with a belt.

Shoes

- Black, brown, purple or white dress shoes, athletic shoes and sandals (no stripes)

- Shoes must have a back strap

WHAT YOU CANNOT WEAR

Shirts & Jackets

- Jean/Denim jackets of any color
- Off the shoulder tank tops or blouses
- Halter, fishnet or see through tops
- Spaghetti straps

Pants & Skirts

- Jeans/Denim of any color
- Sagging or oversized pants or shorts
- Skirts with slits
- Short shorts or short skirts
- Cargo pants or sweatpants
- Stretch pants, shorts, skirts or leggings

Shoes

- Shoes with colored stripes other than Sac High colors
- Flip flops or other shoes without a back strap
- Shoes or sandals with heels over 2"

Accessories and Other Items

- Hats, hoods or caps
- Bandanas, hair scarves, hairnets, curlers, sweatbands or wave caps
- Hairstyles that interfere with learning
- Grills
- Gang-related symbols, insignias or other gang apparel
- Pajamas
- PE clothes (except during PE)
- Professional or college paraphernalia, FUBU, M&M or DADA (no matter what color)

Hair

- No red, pink or bright colored hair

Note: Dress that compromises student modesty, interferes with learning or is otherwise inappropriate is not acceptable. This includes, but is not limited to overly short or tight clothing, ripped outfits or outfits with holes and clothing that exposes bare midriffs and backs.
